

Severe Chronic Absenteeism and 4-Year Graduation for the Oregon High School Class of 2020

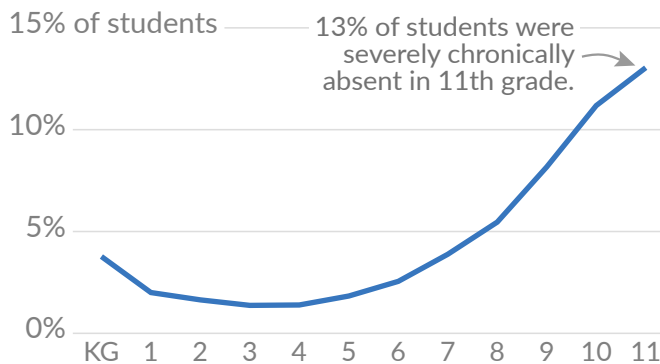
Focus: Timing and Frequency

26% of students in the Class of 2020 were ever severely chronically absent (7,890 students).

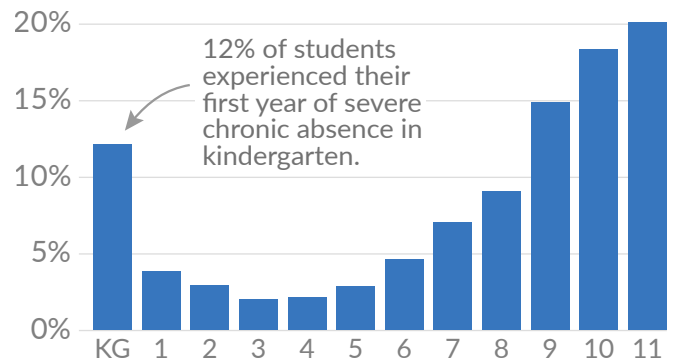


TIMING OF SEVERE CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM

FIRST YEAR OF SEVERE CHRONIC ABSENTEEISM



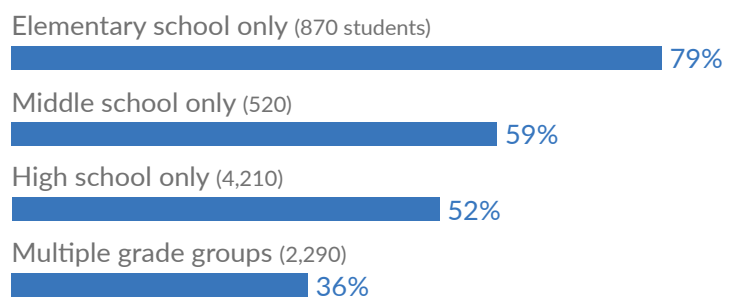
4-YEAR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION RATES BY FREQUENCY AND TIMING

The overall 4-year graduation rate for students who were ever severely chronically absent was **51%**.
